Key Communicator Update

Alberta School Councils Association (ASCA)

- ASCA is a provincial organization that represents parents on school councils to engage with Alberta's Education Ministry.
- ASCA offers guidance, school council training, and advocacy, serving as a collective voice for school councils across the province in discussions with the provincial government and education stakeholders.
- We attended the ASCA Annual General Meeting (AGM) on April 27, 2025 and will attend the meeting in 2026. School councils vote on key advocacy issues. While councils provide their input, the ultimate decision rests with the government.

Key Communicator Update (cont.)

CBE Community of School Councils (COSC)

- COSC facilitates engagement at the Calgary Board of Education (CBE) level.
- COSC is comprised of school council chairs or designates from all CBE schools, members of the Board of Trustees and representatives from CBE administration.
- Through COSC, the CBE can focus on effective, two-way dialogue with school councils about school and student learning issues.

IB Sub-Committee

- Hosted the 'Post Secondary Application Information Session' on Thursday Sept 18,

- Established in 1983
- Non-profit organization
- Canada Revenue Agency Charitable status; subject to various rules, restrictions, and requirements
- Friends of Western oversees the money raised through major fundraisers, issues tax receipts to donors, and completes AGLC and Revenue Canada filings
- Not a parent society no special interest groups

Objective:

- Facilitate extra-curricular activities to maximize student involvement
- Money raised through fundraising initiatives and donations flows through the organization to benefit current students
- Ensure funds are distributed fairly to the many extracurricular groups
- Ensure ALL students have a place to participate
- Funds are not invested for the future and are distributed within 2 years

Who Are the "Friends of Western"????

- Board of Directors are the only members
- Up to 15 directors
- Members are recruited by the Board of Directors
- Directors are connected to WCHS
 - Past students
 - Parents of past students involved in extracurricular activities
 - o Parents heavily involved with WCHS through school council, volunteerism, etc.
- WCHS administration decides where money is spent
- Interest in ensuring the money raised for the extracurricular programs are used to the benefit of <u>all</u> students. Not representing one particular group.
- Skill set in accounting, governance, charitable organizations, or passion for WCHS!

Fundraisers for Extra-curricular Activities

- Fundraising provides funds for extra-curricular activities at WCHS
- Parents run the fundraising activities at WCHS
- Friends of Western is <u>not</u> responsible for fundraising activities at WCHS
- Friends of Western oversees the funds raised, issues tax receipts to donors, and completes AGLC and Revenue Canada filings
- Casinos and Celebrate Western are the main fundraisers at WCHS, and are chaired and managed by WCHS parents
- Casinos occur approximately once every 18 months
- Celebrate Western occurs annually as an online auction and was a gala prior to Covid. It began 35 years ago to have an integrated fundraiser reduce the burden on the neighbouring community with repeated requests for donations, and on the parents for multiple smaller initiatives that benefited only individual groups. All funds collected through Celebrate Western benefit the WHOLE school community.
- Contact school administration or School Council to volunteer for fundraisers

Friends of Western Fundraising Policy

- All fundraising activities must first be approved by the WCHS administration.
- Direct cash donations to the school through the school administration do not require prior approval. Tax receipts will be written for these donations.
- Friends of Western must have the approval of any fundraising activity in which our name or charitable number is used whether it requires/promises a tax receipt or not. A written proposal must be submitted to the Friends of Western Executive.
- Tax receipts will only be written for pre-approved fundraising activity. If there is no prior approval, Friends will not write the tax receipts.
- Tax receipts can only be written by a Friends of Western Board Member under the guidance of the Treasurer.
- Raffles and casinos are a great source of fundraising but have specific rules and must be approved by Friends of Western.
- Crowdfunding, such as GoFundMe, or any other funding opportunity which is new to Friends of Western, requires prior approval by Friends of Western as the funds must be accounted for by our Treasurer.
- Donations directly through 'social fundraising' such as Benevity or Canada Helps, do not require prior approval.
